| 5.1 | One race will be sailed.  |

| 5.2 | The race will use a pursuit start based on each boat's JAM PHRF rating. Each boat is responsible for looking up their start time from the starting sequence table in Addendum B. The first start time will be at 11:00am.  |

| 6   | RACE CLASSES AND CREW  |
| 6.1 | This race is limited to class Jib and Main (JAM) only; no class flags will be displayed or used.   |
| 6.2 | The fleet may be subdivided based on PHRF rating numbers and the number of competitors registered. | 7.1 | Sail numbers must comply with<br>RRS 77 and Appendix G. Sail<br>numbers not matching the boat<br>registration may be scored as DNF<br>by the Race Committee.   |
| 8   | RACING AREA  |
| 8.1 | The racing area is in the northwest corner of Lake Erie, located near Grosse Ile in both Michigan and Canadian waters.   |

| 10.2 | A round white or orange inflatable buoy may replace a missing mark in the original position. Competitors will be notified by Race Committee when a replacement buoy has been set.   |
| 10.3 | If a missing mark has <u>not</u> been replaced by an inflatable buoy or as prescribed in RRS 34, a virtual rounding using the published GPS coordinates in Addendum A will be allowed. The Person In Charge (Skipper) shall document the virtual rounding and make such documentation available in the event of a protest. This changes RRS 34. |
| 11   | THE START   |
| 11.1 | The race will use a pursuit start based on each boat's JAM PHRF rating. Each boat is responsible for looking up their start time from the starting sequence table in Addendum B.  |
| 11.2 | The starting line is between a staff displaying an ORANGE flag on the race committee boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark. The port end starting mark shall be the WSSC RACE BUOY designated in the Course Description in Addendum A.  |

| 11.3 | The race committee boat may utilize a protection buoy specifically secured with that intention. This buoy is considered to be an extension of the race committee boat. No yacht may contact the protection buoy, or sail between the protection buoy and the race committee boat.  |

| 11.4 | If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee boat may as a courtesy attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, failure of her to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a). |
| 11.5 | Physical contact with the race committee boat will result in automatic disqualification (DSQ) by the Race Committee without appeal. This changes RRS 31 and A5.1.  |
| 12   | THE FINISH   |
| 12.1 | The finishing line is between a staff displaying an ORANGE flag on the committee boat at the port end and the course side of the finishing mark.   |
| 12.2 | The committee boat will record the finish order and time for each finishing yacht. Due to the pursuit start, the finish times will not be adjusted with any PHRF correction.   |
| 13   | PENALTY SYSTEM   |
| 13.1 | For all classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.  |

| 14.1       | A boat wishing to protest must inform the race committee boat of their intention to protest, either by hail or VHF, after finishing and must inform a member of the WSSC Race Committee within two hours of finishing (or retiring) of their intent to file protest. By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes. |
